Dear Beloved People of God,



SESSION NOTES

The Session met on Tuesday, May 3, 2022, in Cassel Chapel at 7 pm. Rev. Robin Morgan served as Moderator. The Session received reports and discussed various items related to the mission and operations of the church.

The church continues to work with Ministry Architects on strategic planning development. The congregation will be invited to

participate at a dinner and meeting on May 31.

The Session passed the following motions:

Approval a \$500 donation to Lebanon Rescue Mission for the local mission emphasis in May.

Approval for Rev. Allison Smith to baptize Dashiell James Morgan on May 8, 2022.

Approval to have the Mission Committee create a St. Andrews Relay for Life team for the American Cancer Society.

Approval of the updated job description for the Office Manager. Approval to restart serving the Free Noon Meal at the church on the second Saturday of the month.

The Session will meet again on June 7, 2022, at 7:00 pm.



SESSION NOTES

The session met on Tuesday, June 7, 2022. Pastor Robin opened with a reading of Acts 2:36 followed by a discussion. We noted special lines in this reading and why they stood out to us individually.

The Transformation Team was in attendance and reported on the summit meeting with the ministry architects. St. Andrew's mission statement and listed values were discussed at length and revised. The session unanimously voted to receive these updated mission and value statements.

Mission Statement: Inspired by the love of Christ, we are building a community that invites our neighbors into a relationship with God and each other.

Values:

<u>Christ First-</u> We will do all things as a reflection of Christ. <u>Inviting-</u> We will extend Christ's welcome to all.

<u>Joyful-</u> We will vibrantly serve Christ with courage, enthusiasm, and a fun-loving attitude.

<u>Open-Minded</u>- We will embrace people and consider ideas with empathy and without judgement.

Committee notes:

<u>+ Worship Committee:</u> Wednesday WOW services will begin on June 15th at 7PM. There are still some spots open to share your faith journey at that service.

+ Deacons: Among their notes, it was reported that they've increased efforts to reach "lost sheep" from our congregation.

+ Trustees: There currently is no hot water in the building. This problem should be resolved within the next few weeks. The masonry outside of the building is being considered for repair. The radiant heat in classroom 8 is also slated for repair.

+ Mission Committee: Free Noon Meal will now be served inside the building as directed by LCCM.

<u>+Congregational Life:</u> July 10th is a potluck luncheon and September 11th will be "Kick Off Sunday" with more details to come.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer.



A Grief Support Group of St. Andrews Church

Never forget that you are not alone. The Divine is with you, helping and guiding. He is the companion who never fails, the friend whose love comforts and strengthens. Have faith and He will do everything for you. Aurobindo (Hindu)

Loneliness is one of the afflictions of grief. We miss the one who has died, but that's not all. We miss the world the way it used to be, without this loss that shadows our every step. We miss the image of the future with this loved one in it.

We feel alone because so much of our life right now is internal – the agonizing questions, the turmoil. Who can share that with us? We feel separated from the rest of the world. We walk along the street and the people we pass seem carefree and unburdened. Of course our families and friends are close, but even they cannot know the depths of our grief. To whom do we turn? The St. Andrews Grief Support Group is one place someone who has suffered the loss of a loved one can turn for help. The members of the group have all been in that same place of confusion and turmoil during the course of our grieving and have found the way to overcome those feelings of alone-ness and separation. Because we have had similar experiences, we can try to be of help to those who are newly grieving and feeling so alone. We share ways in which we were able to get past certain milestones, and ways to cope with feelings and emotions that seem to come from "out of the blue". We even continue to help those of the group for whom the death of the loved one was years ago, but still have moments of great sadness. Talking and sharing stories and situations seems to be wonderful "medicine" in these instances.

Anyone is welcome to come to our meetings, no matter what your situation – we are here to help. We would be glad to see you and help you through this period of sadness and loneliness.

Our regular meeting time is the 2nd Thursday of every month at 2:00 PM, in Cassel Chapel.
