

A Note from Pastor Robin

Dear Beloved People of God,

Here we are, in what I think of as the bleak mid-winter. February is my most difficult weather month. And while I didn't research any history regarding Valentine's Day, it seems helpful, in the midst of these grey (sometimes grumpy & grouchy) mid-winter days, to take some time to remember to love. Paul wrote to the Church at Corinth (and to us):

"Love is patient, love is kind... Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends.... And now faith, hope and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love." (1 Corinthians 13 selected verses)

Patience, kindness, endurance. Honestly, many days I don't get out of the house before I have failed at these three. And yet, it is those closest to us, who can give us the most practice at love – the kind of love God has and gives to us. Critical moments can also remind you of what is truly important. A family member in the middle of a serious health crisis is doing this for me. And so (whether you love or don't love this time of year) let us hold onto a few things in this mid-winter month:

- 1. You are loved by God. Always, without end, no matter what...God loves you. (If you still are unsure of this, check out Romans 8:38-39)
- 2. We are invited, asked, told to live in God's love and to reflect this love to others. And so, with the cultural excuse of Valentine's Day, how can we find creative, fun, meaningful ways to reflect God's love with those we spend the most time with? Is there someone God is putting on your heart in this season, that you could find a way to show and share God's love?
- 3. This love becomes vitally important as we face our human frailty near the end of the month, on Ash Wednesday. *We are dust and to dust we shall return*. This is something we can claim, especially as we lean back on God's love that is never ending. It is our comfort, in life and in death. In every day, even our worst days, even the days we need more help than we would dare ask for...we need to remember that God loves us, always.

In this month, may we turn to God's love and give God's love. As you look through the news in the following pages you will see: reminders that Lent that is coming, updates from committees, some new plans and ideas, a word of thanks for our Trustees, a few structure shifts, and even a scavenger hunt. In these days, in the days ahead, in our life together may we let love lead us. Love binds all these things together, and binds us together in Christ.

May the love of God enfold you and carry you through. In the Love of Christ, *Pastor Robin*

What does this mean for you?

The Property committee will take over care for the building, grounds and equipment that the Trustees cared for so well. *If you see a need with the property, please call or email the church office to let the committee know!*

- **Our Committee meeting schedule**: As we work to re-balance our energy as a church with both discipleship and committee work we are moving to having only 2 nights a month when our committees will meet (Our two Boards, Session and Deacons, will continue on their own meeting nights). This month, we are trying out the 2nd Monday and 3rd Tuesday as our committee nights. We will begin together in the sanctuary to gather around God's word and pray and then spread out to various spaces for the work of Christ's church. If you have a question or conflict with the committee night, please talk to the appropriate committee chair. *It is good to serve the Lord together and to make room to grow in the Lord*.
- **Shifting Ministries:** Congregational Life has taken a new name: *The Fellowship Committee*. They will focus on our fellowship as a family of faith. Our Board of Deacons are now embracing *all congregational care*, including connecting our visitors and shepherd-ing new members. Be on the lookout for ways to connect to meaningful ministries that God places on your heart.



LITTLE FREE PANTRY:

The pantry is being used every day. Several members put items in on a regular basis. Thanks to everyone. If you prefer, you can place items in the bin across from the Christian Ed office.

Some reminders:

Remember only non-perishables should be put in.

If you are putting in canned goods, all types are welcome. If you are able, those with fliptop lids are good because some folks may not have can openers. You can put in items that are in <u>plastic jars, just no glass jars please!</u>

Easily-prepared dishes such as mac & cheese or mashed potatoes are always needed. If you can find mixes that use water as an ingredient rather than milk and/or butter, those are even better.

Tea bags, instant coffee, powdered creamer, and packs of sugar.

Cereal is good, but boxed milk makes it a treasure.

Tuna in foil packs and crackers can make a good lunch.

Don't forget things like feminine hygiene items, toilet paper, toothbrushes, toothpaste, and tissues.

Session Notes

The Session met in the chapel on Jan 3, 2023. The meeting opened with candle lighting, prayer, and a reading from Isaiah and a discussion on Epiphany and asking "What are you looking for?". Answers included: opportunities for service, blessings, a focus on today and hope.

The proposed Bylaw changes that will be presented to the congregation were reviewed and approved. This includes the Session meeting as the Board of Trustees as necessary, and the newly named Property committee will get quotes and do the work of the Trustees. The numbers of Deacons and Nominating committee members will decrease.

<u>Committee Meeting Nights</u>: reducing the number of meeting nights to two (excluding Deacons and Session) was discussed. This will allow expansion of study and fellowship opportunities. The third Tues at 7pm and second Monday at 5:30pm were chosen as committee nights starting in February. The motion was approved by all as proposed by Lew Sauerwein and seconded by Bill Mulligan. Committee chairs will let the office know their choice and if zoom links are needed. Robin will be responsible for the first devotional time.

<u>Transformation Team</u>-Kayla reported that she is still seeking all volunteer job descriptions. She spoke about how structure of committees is being solidified, staff time is being used efficiently and communication is being enhanced. Many are not externally evident but behind the scenes. Bill discussed how we need to highlight the changes to the congregation to let them fully appreciate the impact and progress.

Committee reports:

<u>Trustees</u> still working on the radiant heat in the basement.

Deacons will work with attendance records as well as ministering to their flocks.

<u>Christian Ed</u>: "Follow-ship" meetings are going well. Any who want to join should let the office, Rebecca or Gayle know. Rob Cochran's report highlighted the need for continued prayer and dinner makers.

<u>Mission</u> had a busy December and thanked everyone for the good response to the Angel tree, coat collection, alternative gift fair and Christmas Joy offering.

<u>Admin & Personnel</u> a motion was made by Bill Mulligan seconded by Carla Dowd and approved that Daphne's granddaughter, Iris be added to the payroll on an occasional basis when help is needed. The current budget will cover this.

Stewardship and Finance did not meet. We will finish the year about 240,000. over budget.

<u>Nominating</u> did offer an invitation to Doug Lister to accept the last opening on session along with the office of President of the Board of Trustees. He accepted the invitation.

<u>Fellowship</u> (prev. Cong. Life) presented its report. Carla made a motion that the committee should change to the Fellowship committee. This was seconded by Kayla and approved. Carla also made a motion that a 'tasteful donation opportunity' be in the coffee hour area. The money will be used to offset coffee hour expenses. Dennis Shalters seconded and approved. The New Era group is scheduled for lunch at Quentin Haus Jan 26th at noon.

Two Session members were finishing their terms; Robin Gries (6 years) and Dennis Shalters (3 years). They were thanked for their service and presented with a thank-you plant.

Penny Samuelson closed the meeting with prayer.
