

A Note from Pastor Robin

Dear Beloved People of God,

As I am writing, it is still February, and yet I already feel like Lent and March Madness were made to go together. The Flowers and my wardrobe can't figure out if it is winter or spring. My own extended family is trying to adjust to a different life, after one short and one long stay in the hospital. And here at church, we are moving forward with our Technology upgrades, which in reality means that everything works, and then nothing works, and we move forward knowing it will work better....once we get through the wilderness, once we navigate through the uncertain bumps in the road. (I came back from lunch one day and Comcast was there putting up a new cable, because a squirrel had eaten through the one we had. This stuff doesn't even happen in dreams, but it does in real life.) And so we have: madness, uncertainty, transitions, and Lent.

In this season, we will gather around scripture stories, that we can connect to, right in the midst of these days. Stories with people like us, such as:

Adam and Eve, contemplating boundary issues;

Jesus in the wilderness surrounded by temptation;

Abram heading to an uncertain place - a place that God says, He will show him;

Peter confidently stepping out onto the water, until he starts sinking;

A man healed, while the whole community criticizes instead of celebrates;

And with dry bones and a dear friend, being surprised by how God revives life.

Maybe we too need to be revived.

In the midst of this crazy life, the season of Lent offers us space to reflect, to re-direct our lives, to re-engage our faith, and to find a way to live our faith, trusting God, in the uncertainty.

If you happen to watch any of the March Madness Games, you will see College Students, in great shape and playing their very best, in each game. You will see these basketball players, use skills they have practiced for years. The draw on skills and years of practice as they play in these games that all are so important. We know this takes practice, and yet so often in our lives, we try and skip that part where we practice - and just play.

We need to practice our faith. It needs to be ok to say:

I never learned that skill in my life of faith.

I don't really feel confident praying, or reading scripture.

I don't really understand what it means to follow Jesus.

Will you help me learn it now?

I need more ways to practice faith, sitting in church is not enough for me anymore, would you practice with me?

Wherever you find yourself, in this season, join with me in this intentional season of Lent. It is on the days filled with madness or uncertainty that we are most willing to reach out and grab onto God. Yet, we can reach out and grab onto God, in any day and every day. We are a people of faith. Let us practice our Faith, so we can live our faith, for any and every day.

O Lord we want to believe. We want to follow. We want to live our faith. Help us, we pray. Amen.

Discipleship Opportunities

Hello, All,

I'd like to take a moment to share with you about the Followship Group I am in. Our members are Doug Lister, Katie Martel, Tim Peelen, Kim Briggs, Dave Overholt, and Donna Kuntz, and we meet twice a month on Mondays at 7pm. Our group has a set number of folks and we meet regularly on Monday evenings; yet, if we have to miss, we do. Grace abounds, which allows for flexibility!

I especially have enjoyed getting to know my Followship friends on a deeper level. While I have known them all for several years, the Icebreaker Questions that begin each session have allowed me to discover things about them that I never knew (like that Tim had to chop and haul wood to heat his house in upstate New York growing up—wow!). I have also appreciated reading Scripture together and picking it apart, chewing on it, digesting it like a good meal. The Holy Spirit opens our eyes to see and hear Scripture from different contexts and viewpoints, revealing the multi-faceted aspect inherent within it. This is both a challenge and a gift. For example, when each of us read Philippians 2 from our various Bibles, we discovered very different wording, resulting in very different layers of meaning. We realized that one version used the word "grasped" in verse 6, while another used the phrase "to be used to his own advantage," and still another used "exploited"! We even discussed what our own synonym for this word might mean. It's tiny details like this that keep Bible reading fresh for me, as there's nothing like reading and sharing in community.

At our last meeting, Doug brought some of his homemade carrot cake to share. It was such a welcome surprise -- such a small thing—yet so meaningful. I would encourage other Followship groups to consider having simple snacks or even a meal when you can, as it is yet another way to connect with each other. Hospitality is an important theme in the entire Bible, whether it was Abraham offering food to secret angels, or Jesus sharing tables with sinners. And eating is fun!

Finally, I have loved watching each of our members take a crack at facilitating the discussion. Since everyone is a leader, everyone gets to decide the pace of the session at some point. For example, when Doug led our discussion last week, he put the passage into context by reading what came *before it*, then what came *after it*. We all found this very useful. Just because Doug did it that way, however, doesn't mean it has to be done that way every time. The structure of each session allows for all types of freedom in how it's considered.

As I said in my sermon a few weeks ago, I believe strongly that Followship Groups are a critical part of getting us to where Ministry Architects—and the Holy Spirit—are leading us. Our mission goals state we are "Christ first." We cannot follow Christ and keep him first if we don't know what the Bible says about him. We cannot follow if we don't know who we're following, and know him as more than just a nice fellow we talk about every week in church. In Followship, we are digging deep into who Jesus was/is, what his message was/is, and more importantly, how that changes our own behavior in response.

As Christians, we believe that God speaks to us in different ways. God is speaking through you in your daily life. *There is a Followship group that needs to hear your story, that needs to hear God through you.* Please consider joining a group or starting one yourself.

To take stock of where we are right now in our Christian Education, the Christian Ed committee will be hosting a gathering after church on Sunday May 7th, 2023 in Snyder Hall. The meeting will be short, but we will be pondering questions like: What has been your most meaningful Christian Education experience at St. Andrews (or elsewhere)? If you're not in a Follow-Ship group, would you be open to trying other new types of programs and activities to help you grow in your faith and be closer to God?
