SESSION NOTES

The Session of St. Andrews met on Tuesday September 6th in Cassel Chapel at 7pm.

An action was approved by Session to accept the following new members: IvaJean Conley, Bonnie Houtz (wife of Rev. Dick Houtz who is a member of Presbytery) Astrid Santiago, Andy & Sherri Timm, Coleen Tuisl, Artemis Tuisl & Morgan Witman. Be sure to make our new members feel most welcome.

An action was approved by Session to support the Christian Education Committee's proposed small group study on discipleship to be launched this fall. The groups are to be known as Follow-ship Groups. Each group will have a facilitator and resource materials and will decide there meeting time and place. Look for sign up sheets in the Gathering Place.

A motion was brought by the Stewardship & Finance Committee on behalf of the Technology Committee, and approved by Session, for expenditures to upgrade various technology infrastructures in the church. These items include a new cellular based phone system, needed upgrade to digital and expanded capacity audio mixer, upgraded live stream video camera switcher and cameras, a large screen TV to replace the deteriorating rear facing projector, a TV for the Nursery to facilitate streaming the service by Nursery attendants, a large screen TV for the Gathering Place for service streaming and display of announcements and dissemination of other church information, a large screen TV for Snyder Hall to be used for Movie Nights and congregational meetings where visual information display would be helpful and surveillance cameras and monitoring equipment for the Poplar Street entrance and Spark Park.

The Transformation Team has outlined three broad goals for attainment by 2025 along with implementation steps and benchmark criteria to assess progress. The goals are, by 2025:

- a) Create a balance for all adult, youth, children, and young adults to be more actively involved in discipleship activities than in committee meetings.
- b) Each member will have a regular rhythm of inviting at least three people, each year, into our welcoming worshiping community.
- c) We will re-imagine how we use and invest in our physical and online space to bless our neighborhood, by leveraging and elevating our members' existing community relationships and partnerships.
