A Note from Pastor Robin

Dear Beloved People of God,

We come into November facing *All Saints Day* where we remember those we loved and lost, facing an election that reminds us of the difficult election year ahead, facing a world spinning into more and more conflict, facing *Christ the King* Sunday that points to a different way, and facing a day of thanksgiving. Our lives could be consumed by any one of these. We have to choose what we allow to fill us, or it will be chosen for us.

I recently read an article in <u>The Week</u> with first-hand accounts from October 8th in Israel. One of the accounts was from a woman at the music festival, she threw herself into a thicket of thorn bushes to escape the gunfire. She lay as motionless as possible, stuck for hours in the thorns. And there is those long hours that surely seemed to never end, and she focused on her breath.

"...breathing and praying in every way I knew possible. Every time I thought of anger, or fear or revenge, I breathed it out," she said. "I tried to think of what I was grateful for – the bush the hid me so well that even birds landed on it, the birds that were still singing, the sky that was so blue." (and finally gratitude for the help that did arrive). From: 'They didn't see us a human beings' in The Week, October 20, 2023.

It would be nice to say that God will protect us from every being in a moment like that. But, that is not one of God's promises to us. The promise we do have is that God will be with us. Gratitude is one of the things that can turn our day, our perspective, our lives around so that we can again, see the presence of God even in the most difficult circumstances.

The Apostle Paul writes in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18: *"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."* May this be what we choose to focus on, and to be filled with. Thanksgiving, is a day that reminds us to give thanks. On our good days, on our stressful days, on the days when we cannot lift up our hearts, and the days we look in dismay at the mess of the world, may we remember AND may we practice living God's Word for us: *give thanks in all circumstances*.

Jesus is above all things, and in the midst of all things. Let us give thanks and praise to God, while lifting up our prayers for one another and the world.




Adult Sunday School Series Class 9AM in the Chapel

What followed was a lengthy discussion of encounters that our church has had with homeless people and the difficulties finding resources to help them when this occurs on weekends. We will be looking for solutions on how we can better work with those who seek refuge on the grounds of St Andrews.

The property committee presented a very complete document concerning use of our facilities by outside entities. Anyone interested in sponsoring an outside group should refer to requirements. The document can be obtained from the church office.

The deacons will make a concentrated effort on having contacts to follow up with visitors.

The worship committee submitted the plan for the Christmas Eve services. There will be two services, one at 10 AM and the second at 7 PM.
