A Note from Pastor Robin

Dear Beloved People of God,

February invites us into the season of Lent. It is a season that invites us to simplify, and to simply draw near to God. This year, the Season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, that falls right on Valentine's Day. We will gather in Snyder Hall at 6PM for a soup supper (all soup makers are invited to bring soup!). We will eat, and right there around the tables worship and share communion. It is a day to remember the love of God, that is with us in the dust.

In the spirit of simplifying and in the Spirit of focusing on God, this year we will be spending Lent, in the Lord's Prayer. We will take just one line per week, to consider each part of the prayer and to spend some time praying just that line. We will have prayer cards, one per week, that offer prompts for your own prayers.

This is a prayer remember learning before I had any idea what "glory" or "hallowed" meant. This is the prayer Jesus gave us, and so perhaps it is the best way to learn, re-learn, or re-connect to prayer. I found this to be true for myself a few months ago on a spiritual retreat. As we walked into evening prayer, we were handed a slip of paper, with one phrase such as: *Thy will be done* or *Give us this day our daily bread*. All of them were one line of the Lord's Prayer. And as we prayed, when the line on our paper was spoken, the space was for us to fill in. To let our prayers focus on God's Will, on what we truly needed for the day, and even on those we needed to forgive. It was a way of praying as a group, that was new to me. This way of praying instantly helped me slow down and focus on the depth, the invitation to pray in each line of the Lord's Prayer.

As we walk through the Lord's prayer, my prayer for each week to offer a meaningful invitation to turn to God, to offer prayers to God and to see God's heart for our prayers. May these words we pray together, be words that draw us together in worship and in our journey of faith.

May God bless us on this journey of prayer.

FOLLOW-SHIP


'Drop-In' Follow-Ship Group 7PM Thursdays in the Gathering Area Thursday (Feb 22, 29 & March 7, 14, 21)

Session Notes January 9, 2024 7 PM Chapel

The meeting was started with a reading/devotion from Isaiah 52.

The contributions of the 3 Elders finishing 6 years of service were reviewed: Bill Mulligan, Carla Dowd and Rebecca Lister. New Elders were welcomed: Rick Borger and Ken Gries.

Ministry Architects will be finishing up this spring- the final discussions will be postponed until May to allow Aqueelah to preach on Pentecost.

Gwen Yordy presented a report on behalf of the Deacons. She thanked everyone for signing the Christmas cards for the shut-ins.

The session approved a change in communion dates from January 7 to January 14.

Mission sought special offerings for Blanket Sunday, One Great Hour of Sharing, and Peace and Global Witness. The reported that Mission week is scheduled for August 4-11.

The financial report was reviewed by the Treasurer highlighting that our financial position is better than we had anticipated.

Election of Bill Mulligan for Clerk of Session and Marc Hamme as Treasurer was made and Approved by all present.

Meeting nights for committees were reviewed. Discussion was held on the presentation of the Annual Reports and an Activity Fair to be held on Jan 28 to allow the congregation to speak with the various committees. Committees were encouraged to have exhibits to demonstrate their work and food. The Congregational Meeting will be brief.

There was discussion of making the newsletter seasonal rather than monthly.

Pastor Robin expressed her hopes to celebrate Eastertide for 50 days. This would include the possibility of a cross in the front yard with messages on each side. Doug Lister will check about digging restrictions. We will be careful not to limit sight lines for traffic.

Rebecca Lister and Bill Mulligan were elected as our commissioners for the Jan 17th meeting of the Presbytery.

We anticipate working on our website this year.
