A Message from Pastor Robin



Dear Beloved People of God,

The other morning, one of the boys was up early, he went downstairs to play and when I came down he asked: "When it is going to be morning, really? Morning when the sun comes up?"

"It is morning," I said. "The sun is up!"

He looked out the window, doubtfully.

This is the time of year, I start to notice the shift in the length of our days. The mornings are not so bright, and the evening comes sooner. It is the time of year to settle in and get serious about preparing for winter. (I know the squirrels are busy). It is also a season, where we remember that we have not only the sunlight, but the light of God.

This Fall, we will get to know Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, because one of the first ways, God was known, was as the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. And there is this passage in scripture, where God is promising Abraham that this childless man will have a legacy. That his descendants will be like the stars - too many to count.

God is also our God. The God of Karen, Alex and Robin. The God of Bob, Nancy and Lew. God is known, even through us. "'Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to (Abraham), 'So shall your descendants be.' And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness." Genesis 15:5-6

May we move into this darker season, drawing nearer to the light of Christ, seeking to reflect more of the light of Christ into the darkness.






