Why Bible in a Year

2 Timothy 3:16-17 " All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work."

The Bible is God's word to us. It offers us challenges, questions, and the struggles of humanity. Most importantly it shows us that God does not give up on us.

To read the Bible in a year, you need 30 minutes to listen or read, 5 days each week.

If there is any part of you that is interested in this, take a leap of faith and say yes! Take on this challenge to journey with God, reading through the Bible in 1 year.

Translations

There are a lot of great translations out there. For Bible in a year it is recommended that you choose a translation that you are comfortable consistently reading. But, you also have the flexibility to wander a little in different translations as well. Feel free to explore!
