

A Letter from One Generation to Another:

March 30 - April 6

"To what then shall I compare the people of this generation, and what are they like?" Luke 7:31

As one of this generation, write a letter to another generation in your family. Choose whoever the Spirit puts on your heart; a child, grandchild, parent, or grandparent.

In the letter, share your story of faith. Don't ask them to believe, *just share* why you believe in Jesus. Share why faith is meaningful to you. Write it and wait for the Spirit to tell you to send it. If the time to send it is unknown, place it with your living will.

As you consider writing, who has the Spirit put on your heart?

Find space without time pressure, and write freely, let your thoughts pour out.

Set it aside.

On another day: read, edit and write letting your words fill in from your heart and your free writing.

Prayerfully consider what is best to do with this letter from your heart.

Will you give, save or hold in trust?

Reflections:
