

The service tonight incorporates the Da Vinci painting of The Last Supper as a model for the presentation of the set and costumes. Jesus and the disciples are dressed in Biblical costumes to represent the painting. Each of the disciples has a short monologue with historical information. The disciples' monologues allow us to hear their inner thoughts. When God called these twelve men to be His disciples and establish the New Testament Church, He chose flawed individuals, people just like you and me; they were all works in progress. This should be a reminder that He is not finished with any of us, and that all of us are guilty of denying and betraying Him. Just as twelve exemplary men had a mission, we also are charged to continue that mission, "to love one another and to share the good news of the Messiah."
