A Message from Pastor Robin



Dear Beloved People of God,

A year ago we started the dual journey of Advent and moving through the whole Gospel of Luke. Advent beautifully led us through Luke chapter 1 with the birth narrative of John the Baptist weaving through the birth narrative of Jesus. I will admit, I was nervous (I think I still am). I have never taken on a worship series longer than a few months, and yet to walk through the Gospel of Luke, without skipping significant sections, I knew it would take us over a year. My hope has always been, that each one of us, would find certainty in the good news of Jesus Christ, by starting to know this one Gospel. This is just what Luke wrote to Theophilus (God lover): "to write an orderly account for you…that you may have certainty concerning the things you have been taught." Luke 1: 3b-4.

On this journey, I have had moments of doubt. This summer, I wondered if these passages were connecting from one week to another. And as we came to September and I clearly understood why those particular passages were rarely preached. And yet, at every moment of doubt, the Spirit offered a moment of encouragement. At every passage that I was tempted to skip, God opened my eyes to see how this Word was the Word we needed, right at that moment. This year Advent comes to Luke 17, 18 and into 19. It is unexpected for this season and yet these chapters lead us to the heart of Advent in a different way. As the Pharisees ask: When the Kingdom of God will come, as the persistent widow reminds us to pray always and not to lose heart, as Jesus welcomes the little children and talks with the rich young ruler who wonders what must I do to inherit eternal life? We will find Advent offering us new ways to come to Jesus, right now, in this year full of ups and downs, in these difficult and confusing days.

The darkness of standard time and the darkness of the world around us invite us to lean into Advent, longing for God to be with us, and longing for the light that shines in the darkness. Starting in Luke 17, the Gospel will offer us Advent through unexpected passages. May it also lead us to an unexpected Advent in our lives, where God unexpectedly interrupts our lives, unexpectedly shines a bright light, unexpectedly brings heaven with angels descending, and where God comes unexpectedly

into these present days, abiding with us, here and now.


The season is full. Calendars may already be overfull. But, may we pray for our own *unexpected Advent*, one we could never put on a calendar, one that overshadows our plans with God's plans.

Come and worship.

Advent is here to prepare us. Christmas is coming to astound us. Epiphany is all ready to lead us.

Sharing Star Words

As we gather for worship on Epiphany, this year on January 4th, we will open our star words together. If you will be at church in person, star words will be held and waiting for you. If you will be online let the church office know. We would love to send you a star word!

You will find the star words in the narthex on the invitation table. Share the words, let them be part of how you give and receive God's wonder and love.

Bible in a Year

By now you may very well have heard the numbers for Bible in a Year. In case you have not heard we spent 118,833 minutes which is 1980 hour, or 82 days listening to the Bible. While the podcast side has been 750 gigabytes of data and 1000+ listens to the podcast. That is an impressive amount of time and energy spent in God's word over the past year!

Interestingly, when we started Bible in a Year last year, I put a Star Word in the bible I used. At the end of Bible in a Year I finally opened that word, it was *ENDURANCE*. What a beautiful final statement to reading through bible in a year. Especially when we consider

Hebrews 12:1 (ESV):

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us"

This past year we have run the race set before us, completing a study of God's word driving us deeper into his love. This journey has brought out new layers of growth understanding and joy in me in new ways. Likewise, I have seen it in everyone who has undertaken this race of endurance. We have spent a year very intentionally embracing scripture, and we will continue that pattern in new ways. There is more to come and very soon!


The Bible From FAST to S L O W





The Session held its regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, November 4, 2025 acted on the following business items:

- · A motion passed to recommend that the minutes of the meeting of the congregation held on October 25, 2025, be presented to the congregation for approval at its annual meeting in January 2026.
- · Session approved guest preachers: Susan Blouch on Nov. 23, 2025 and Rev. John Green on Jan. 11, 2026.
- · Session approved the purchase of a new boiler for \$48,000 to replace the existing one, which is 50 years old.
- · Session elected Bill Mulligan to serve as a Commissioner to the Nov. 19, 2025, meeting of the Presbytery of Carlisle.
- · Session approved Worship Committee plans to have the Living Last Supper play for Maundy Thursday in 2026.
- · The Session reviewed the first draft of the 2026 church budget.
- · The Treasurer's report for the end of October 2025 included Income: \$26,440.56; Expenses: \$47,544.12, and Balance: (\$21,103.56).
- The Safety Task Force reported annual fire drill held in October went very well and noted that the building was entirely cleared in 1 minute, 23 seconds.
